CSA LICENCE REGULATIONS FOR 2010

New CSA Licence Regulations for 2010

In 2009, CSA made it compulsory for all cyclists to become licensed. This rule will continue into 2010. Therefore all cyclists will be required to take out a Cycling License with CSA. **All cyclists will need to do this on their own behalf.** The club will provide you with the details of where this can be done. (See Licensing Procedure) License costs will be over and above your club subscription costs.

The CSA Full Racing Licence

Events run under UCI regulation such as SA Champs, Provincial Champs and Stage Races (and the like will, as usual), require an Elite (full racing license) Licence. This is a Full Racing Licence for all categories i.e. Elites men and woman, Under 16's, Juniors, Under 23's and Vets. For all other events, entrants who do not have a Full Racing License (Elite Licence) will require to have a Cyclo-sport Licence.

The CSA Cyclo-Sport Licence

A Licence card will be issued and licence holders will continue to be required to be a member of a club or a member of their provincial body (i.e. CGC, Pedal Power Association). The price for a Cyclo-Sport Licence is R75. This licence is multi-disciplinary, i.e. valid for Road, MTB, BMX and Track, where applicable.

Licensing Procedure

1. Licensing for 2010 will commence on 7 December 2009 and will use MY RACE as host platform.
2. Log on www.myrace.co.za to apply for your licence.
3. 2009 Licenses will be valid until 31 January 2010.
4. Riders have to renew their club membership, or join a club, as soon as possible.
