



EMBA: HOW TO GET AND USE A TH ACCESS PERMIT - INFO FOR CYCLISTS

1. Get an application form from your club (only club members can get permits, a limited number of permits are available). The Club must be affiliated to EMBA (See website www.emba.org.za)
2. Complete **every part** of the application form legibly, sign / initial where indicated and include a valid email address that you check regularly.
3. Read the indemnity & code of conduct - **the rules will be strictly applied** - we only have permission to use TH private property if we comply with their rules; please don't spoil it for everyone.
4. Applications for minors must be completed / signed by the minor **and** one parent, **and** the parent must sign the additional indemnity and undertaking at the end of the form.
5. No children under 12 may have a permit.
6. Existing licence holders have preference in renewing until 30 November 2009. From 01 December 2009 licences will be issued on a first-come-first-served basis. Existing licence holders can change Club with no penalty, as long as the Club is also affiliated to EMBA
7. Pay R250.00 per adult permit, plus R150.00 spouse/common law spouse and R50.00 for each bona fide dependant (separate forms for each) into the EMBA bank account, or make out a cheque "EMBA":

8. Submit the following to your club admin officer, who will forward it to the EMBA secretary:
 - a) Completed application form (one set of forms for each permit applied for),
 - b) signed indemnity & code of conduct (one set of forms for each permit),
 - c) one passport photo for each permit (name on reverse, stapled to forms), Renewals do not need to submit a photo
 - d) proof of payment or cheque **no cash accepted**;
9. You may only ride on **marked routes** (route maps are available on www.emba.org.za) but you **MUST have your permit with you at all times** and **display your permit number** on a **yellow number board on the front of your bike**.
10. Be polite to TH staff and obey their directions or signs - routes may have to be closed without notice for safety or operational reasons - please remember, it's their land and their business comes first.
11. Treat the land as your own - do not litter (no GU packets), skid, be reckless, etc.
